**Rayville Elementary School
School Choice Information
February 14, 2022**

Dear Parent and/or Guardian:

Federal law requires school districts to offer families in schools that have been identified as a “school in need of improvement” the chance to transfer their children to other public schools in the same district. Your child’s school has been identified as a school in need of improvement and you are allowed to choose to enroll him or her in another school. To help you understand how the choice program works, here are some answers to questions you may have.

Why was Rayville Elementary School identified as a “school in need of improvement” and how does it compare to other schools in Richland Parish and other schools in Louisiana?

According to Louisiana State guidelines, Rayville Elementary School has been deemed a school in need of improvement, with a letter grade of “F”. This letter grade is based on the school data from the 2018-2019 school year.

What is Rayville Elementary School doing to address the problem of low achievement, and what are the school system and the Louisiana Department of Education doing to help them address the problem?

- Staffing with highly qualified teachers
- Effective professional development programs for all instructional staff based on best practices targeting student engagement and academic success
- Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) for students
- Tier I (state approved) curriculum that is aligned with the Louisiana Standards in Math and ELA in all grades
- Reading Interventionists will continue to work with small groups of students
- Computer labs and programs are used to provide technology access and to provide remediation opportunities
- ELA and Math coaches are on campus to assist teachers and leadership team with professional development within the school day
- Parent centered ELA and Math nights each semester
- Interventions in the classroom (math facts, guided reading, iReady Individualized

Instruction, etc.)

- School Building Level Committee meets weekly to evaluate at-risk students and make recommendations to assist student
- Professional Learning Communities meet every other week for teachers to collaborate on building quality assessments
- Accelerated Reading is encouraged and students are rewarded for growth
- Active PTO works to help increase parental involvement
- Parent center allows parents access to educational materials
- JCALL to alert parents of students being absent or tardy to school/class

How can I become involved in addressing the problems that cause Rayville Elementary to be identified as a school in need of improvement? Families are encouraged to arrange a private conference with their child's teachers to discuss ways to improve academic performance. Families are also invited to participate as members of the School Improvement Team at Rayville Elementary School. The School Improvement Team is a group made up of the principal, teacher and parents that work to improve the education and overall learning experience for all students at Rayville Elementary School. Even if a family member does not serve as a member of the School Improvement Team, he or she may attend meetings of the team to discuss possible changes in any area of instruction to improve Rayville Elementary School.

Do I have to transfer my child to another school? No. We are providing families with this opportunity as an option. The decision is entirely up to you, so you should base your decision on **what you think is best for your child.** If you choose to have your child attend school at Rayville Elementary School, continue with the registration process as required. If you do choose to transfer your child to the new school, he or she **must remain there for the full school year. Once Rayville Elementary School becomes academically acceptable, students will return to Rayville Elementary.**

To which schools may my child transfer?

Under the School Choice Program, students at Rayville Elementary School may choose to attend one of the elementary schools listed on the application (see last page). Please note that the letter grades listed are from last year. If you choose to have your child attend one of these schools, please select your first and second choices, with your **first choice as #1**, and your **second choice as #2** on the enclosed choice form. These schools have higher School Performance Scores than Rayville Elementary School.

What if I choose to have my child continue to attend Rayville Elementary School?

You would continue to send your child to Rayville Elementary School as registered.

Is my child guaranteed a place in an accepting school?

Every effort will be made to give parents their first choice if requesting a transfer. However, it is possible that your child may not be granted enrollment in your first school of choice. Students will be granted enrollment in a school based upon **enrollment limits, individual achievement scores, and income levels as prescribed by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).**

Will my child be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities in the new school?

Your child will be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities at the school.

How will my child get to a receiving school?

If your transfer application is approved, your child will have free transportation to the receiving school. Transportation will be provided by the Richland Parish School Board. Should your child become ill and need to go home early, parents must provide transportation home. Transportation will not be provided for the child to attend activities before or after school such as extra-curricular activities or for parents to attend parent meetings and evening programs.

Bus pick-up could be as *EARLY as 5:45 AM*. Return home could be as *LATE as 5:00 PM*.

What is the deadline for applying? Monday, April 4, 2022

You may return your Choice Request form to the Richland Parish School Board prior to **Monday, April 4, 2022**. An application may also be mailed to the following address:

The applications must be postmarked by **April 4, 2022** to be considered.

Applications WILL NOT be accepted after 4:00 PM on Monday, April 4, 2022.

When will you tell me if my transfer application is approved?

Parents will receive an official notification by **Friday, April 8, 2022** informing them if their choice request is approved.

Transfer requests and approvals are for academic purposes ONLY. LHSAA determines athletic eligibility status for all student athletes. For more information, contact your school's athletic director prior to Richland Parish School Board approval of transfer.
